Monday's meeting was the first one for new Trustees Eva Dixon (far right), Susan Gibson (middle left), Christina Speers (far left) and Don Werden (middle right) – all of whom were elected to office during the October 22 Municipal Election. Gibson and Speers are new to their Trustee roles, while Dixon (2010-14) and Werden (2001-03, 2004-06, 2006-10 and 2010-14) previously served as Grand Erie Trustees. The new Trustees joined incumbents Anderson, Collver, Dean, and Sloat as well as Brian Doyle and James Richardson on the Board for the 2018-22 term.





New Native Trustee Begins Term

Claudine VanEvery-Albert (left) also started her new term as Native Trustee. She was nominated on November 30 by Six Nations of the Grand River and formally appointed to the Board on Monday evening.
