Education Week 2019

Education Week is an annual event that's celebrated across the province. The purpose is to highlight student excellence in learning. This year, Education Week takes place May 6-10, with the theme: *Feeling Well... Mind, Body and Spirit.*

Grand Erie's annual Education Week Gala serves as a preview for the weeklong celebration. It features a number of



artistic performances by students, including: singing, dancing, musical theatre and percussion. The Gala takes place on May 2 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the Sanderson Centre in Brantford.

Grand Erie's 2019 Education Week will also include two grand openings. On May 6, the Board will celebrate the opening of Central Public School's Learning Commons. On May 10, Grand Erie will celebrate the official grand opening of Mapleview Elementary School. Achievement is seen through the following statement: "We will set high expectations for our students and staff." Education Technology Initiative Update

Each year, an update on the Educational Technology Plan is provided to Trustees. In 2019, the report includes information on hardware (i.e., student and teacher devices) and professional development (i.e., Digital Lead Learners, Education Technology Projects, Ed Tech Student Crew, etc.) as well as next steps for the plan. IBM Report

In the fall of 2018, IBM Canada's Education Division was hired by Grand Erie to perform a review of the board's current utilization of educational technology. IBM was also tasked with providing recommendations and guidance for the most effective use of digital resources to support learning

in Grand Erie moving forward. IBM completed its work last month. This report supports the Technology indicator of Grand Erie's Multi-Year Plan through the following goal: "Develop measurements to better understand the impact of the Educational Technology initiative on staff and student learning."

Quality Accommodations Review Committee Update

Grand Érie's Quality Accommodations Review Committee is tasked with developing and maintaining a plan that maximizes the benefits for all students as well as meets the following statement of the Environment indicator of the Board's Multi-Year Plan: "We will ensure that students and staff have a safe and welcoming environment in which to learn and work."

Following a review of projected enrolment, the 2018-19 Quality Accommodations Review Committee identified two priorities moving forward for the Board. The first is a Pupil Accommodation Review for Brant/Brantford Secondary Schools, with the scope of work to include possible re-distribution of speciality programming as well as a boundary review to balance enrolment. The second includes four Pupil Accommodation Reviews in the following areas: Haldimand North and Haldimand South Elementary Schools; Haldimand Secondary Schools; Brantford Central Elementary Schools; and, Brantford North Elementary Schools.

2019 Summer School Report

Grand Erie will once again offer Summer School for students this year. Two sites have been selected for the in-class program: Brantford Collegiate Institute and Vocational School and Hagersville Secondary School. Both locations will offer full credit, reach ahead and credit recovery courses. Full credit courses will also be



available through eLearning. Other key elements of the 2019 Summer School program include: Co-op and Dual Credit opportunities, Literacy and Numeracy Programs for Grades 6-8 students, and reach ahead opportunities for students in Grades 7-8. Finally, the Student Biz program is a unique Summer School community partnership with the Brantford-Brant Business Resource Centre that provides students with the chance to learn skills that will enable them to be successful entrepreneurs in a hands-on learning environment. This report supports the Achievement indicator of *Success for Every Student* and the following statement: "We will set high expectations for our students and staff.
