Location for Secondary French Immersion in Haldimand-Norfolk

By the fall of 2020, the initial cohort of dual-track French Immersion students will be entering Grade 9. As a result, a location for Secondary French Immersion in Haldimand-Norfolk is required. At the March 4, 2019 Committee of the Whole Meeting, a report outlined a number of factors that needed to be considered in determining



the location. The report included recommendations on where French Immersion students would go in 2020-21 as well as the creation of a new boundary map. The report also outlined next steps for consulting with French Immersion students, parents and families in Haldimand-Norfolk, including a survey and program information night.

Following the completion of consultation, a final report on the location for Secondary French Immersion in Haldimand-Norfolk was presented to Trustees on Monday night. The report recommends that Burford District Elementary School/Paris Central Public School students attend the existing French Immersion program at North Park Collegiate and Vocational School beginning September 2020. It also recommends that Caledonia Centennial Public School/River Heights School, Lakewood Elementary School and Walsh Public School students attend a French Immersion program at Simcoe Composite School beginning September 2020. Following discussion of the report, Trustees approved the recommendations in the report and recommended it for approval at the May 27, 2019 Regular Board meeting.


Student Trustees for 2019-20

City of Brantford Honours 'The Future' from Russell Reid Public School

At the April 30 City of Brantford Council Meeting, the students who dubbed themselves 'The Future' received an Environmental Recognition Award from the City's Environmental Policy Advisory Committee. 'The Future' is a group of Intermediate students at Russell Reid Public School who want a serious reduction in the burning of fossil fuels and are trying to eliminate plastic products in Brantford, including single-use plastic straws. These students are committed to the global

youth movement calling for government action on Climate Change. They call themselves 'The Future' because they believe that the earth needs protection for their future and the future of all generations. Earlier this year, they held a rally outside their school to draw attention to the need for action on Climate Change. They also encouraged all Grand Erie schools to participate in Climate Action on April 26 as part of Earth Week celebrations.
