D – 1 Director's Report

Patti McCleister Leadership Award:

The Patti McCleister Memorial Award is given on an annual basis to the Grand Erie employee who best embodies Patti's passion and has shown great leadership and effort within their role. This year's recipient was presented to Lynn Abbey, Principal of Delhi District Secondary School. She was described by many as a caring and compassionate advocate for staff and students, and has evolved into the administrator she is today through exemplary leadership in the areas of engagement, environment and achievement. In addition to being Principal at Delhi District Secondary School, Abbey is also active in other areas of leadership including the Aspiring Leaders Program, Global Day of Dignity Student Conference and the Leadership and Development Committee. She also never hesitates to provide mentorship and coaching to many of her colleagues.

Presentation - Link Crew at North Park Collegiate-Vocational School

Students and staff from North Park came to the Board to share their experience about the Link Crew. Senior students mentor Grade 9 students with activities and support on the first day school in September and throughout the year.

Three hundred Grade 9 students were greeted by Grade 11 and 12 Link Crew Leaders, dedicated to help ease the transition for new students at NPC. The whole Grade 9 class was divided into groups of ten and two Link Leaders with whom they will all be locker mates for the year. Students are connected to senior mentors who've been trained and are sharing the school culture."

- D. Dean thanked them for their enthusiasm and is pleased to see learning is fun, spirit-oriented and that a mutual trust is being valued in the school.
- A. Nesbitt was pleased to report that the Board received \$30,000 from the Ministry to develop programs that will assist single parents in completing their secondary school program and position students to carry on with post-secondary education. The program will be located at GELA.

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D. Abbey was pleased to report that the Board received \$23,000 from the Council of Directors of Education to go towards Robotics Projects occurring in elementary schools. Robotic kits are ordered centrally with a priority given for socio-economic challenged schools.

G – 1 New Business

(a) Major Construction Update

- R. Collver inquired about the change in date for Lakewood Daycare Retrofit. J. Gunn explained that the delay was due to moisture content found where the flooring was to be laid.
- G. Anderson inquired about Coronation and is it is still on schedule to open September 2016. J. Gunn explained that the expected work should be done by the end of June 2015.
- D. Dean addressed the previous report and changes to the Coronation Project. J. Gunn explained that the site plan approval process that slows down the commencement of work. The pre-approval process involves discussion with municipal staff to get feedback and pending direction, the go-ahead for site planning. This process can take many weeks to complete.

(b) 2014-2015 Board Improvement Plan for Student Achievement Goals

In August of 2015 preliminary OSSLT results were released. Those results along with the final report card data are currently being reviewed. The release of the EQAO Grade 9 Assessment of mathematics results is anticipated on October 28, 2015. Grade 3 and 6 EQAO testing was cancelled in the spring of 2015.

Student Success/Secondary Program:

- A. Nesbitt reviewed the following goals:
 - Improve achievement in credit accumulation
 - Improve achievement in Grades 9-12 mathematics
 - Improve in literacy to support credit accumulation and graduation rates
 - Improve achievement in grades 3-8 mathematics. Program and instruction will focus on problem-solving and investigation of important mathematical concepts.

Special Education Goals for Student Success/Secondary Program 2014-2015

- L. Thompson reviewed the following goals:
 - To improve success rates on the OSSLT for time eligible students identified with learning disabilities from baseline of 17%
 - To improve credit accumulation rates for students with special education needs (excluded gifted)
- A. Nesbitt explained that a baseline is determined where the last cohort left off in 2014 EQAO results.
- R. Collver congratulated S. Sincerbox and the Special Education Team for focusing on this particular program and teachers.
- D. Dean inquired about number sense and numeration and patterning.
- A. Nesbitt explained the strategy around proportional reasoning is the ability for a student to calculate in their head before they work it out on paper. The ability to predict what the solution should look like acts as a compass for the student when solving a problem.



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Numeration provides a stronger understanding of mathematical terms and the use of number systems.

D. Sowers inquired if the reason that the LINK program is not in all of the secondary schools is due to funding. A. Nesbitt explained that these programs are funded, growth should be seen throughout the board as word spreads of the effectiveness of the program, school-based leaders are required to take this program on.

A. Nesbitt clarified that the number of students who reach ahead with credit accumulation will be presented in the summer school report.

C.A. Sloat inquired if the process where math strands are taught on the same schedule still exists system wide. B. Blancher responded that it still exists system wide, with the elementary schools. It is part of the Math Alignment Project that was developed to address the transient population in some schools and then the decision was made to adopt the process across the board.

B. Blancher explained that each September the BIPSA team meets to develop an annual plan. The plan is influenced by the Ministry of Education and requires a number of data sets are reviewed. A new model will be introduced at this meeting that better aligns with other plans around the province and meets expectations from the Ministry.

There is no primary or junior EQAO results or grade 9 data and the Ministry is aware of the challenges faced by school boards this year. Grade 9 data will be available in early November.

Trustee feedback is welcomed for the draft plan.

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L. De Vos reviewed the draft plan in the new format and shared components and content of the BIPSA Plan:

- Needs Assessment (Baseline Data)

C.A. Sloat inquired if there will be actual goals (ie: increase of 4%). B. Blancher explained that due to the lack of EQAO data for primary/junior, it is challenging to determine baselines. The information on the report will indicate if changes need to be made midcycle should results show that initiatives are not working.

Trustees commented they were pleased to see that the new style of report is cyclical, comprehensive, well laid out and easy to conceptualize.
