SOME PROGRAM NOTES...

MATH: We are into algebra and geometry right now. We are applying algebraic expressions to tables of values and then plotting ordered pairs on the four quadrants. Next, we will be plotting ordered pairs and applying translations (slides), reflections (flips), rotations (turns) and dilatations.

LANGUAGE: The students are wrapping up a poetry unit. I have been quite impressed by their insights as we have read and analyzed poetry, as well as their creative, humorous and heartfelt written works.

SCIENCE: We will be wrapping up our unit on Fluids in the next couple of weeks.

GEOGRAPHY: As Grade 8 Geography is a study of interactions between humans and their environment, we are finishing our year with an inquiry related to current issues facing our planet, as well as possible solutions. Students have individually chosen to explore human exploitation in the chocolate industry, human exploitation and the environmental impact of the cotton industry, how to feed our exploding global population, the dying coral reefs, our plastic oceans, and how to live sustainably. Students have time in class to view a wide variety of recommended You Tube videoclips and read online sources in order to become experts on the topic of their choice. They received a highly-detailed project outline. Along with a text submission, there is also an artistic submission (poster, song, or poem). This project is due on June 7th. Time will be given in class, but there is no time to waste! \odot
