

### **Elgin's Coding Team**

On Saturday, May 24, four intermediate Elgin students travelled to North Park Collegiate in Brantford as part of Grand Erie District School Board's first ever Coding Fair. Activities for the day included working with simple robotics and engaging in challenges designed to teach basic computational thinking skills. Using a form of early coding literacy referred to as block coding, the students created sets of directions to get the devices to navigate simple mazes, or to carry out a set of commands to display a certain shape on an LED screen. For their efforts, the group was rewarded with a third place finish from the ten teams that took part from all over Grand Erie. It was a close finish too, given that Elgin's team was only one point away from a tie for second place! Way to go Carley, Carson, Bella and Imogen! Thanks to Mrs. Backus-Kelly for leading this work!
