

As a class, we are still working on following class routines, remembering to work quietly, and remembering to wait our turn (being one of twentyseven is hard for them)! Having said this, I am really enjoying their enthusiasm and their desire to learn new things.

The students put forth an excellent effort with their Fair Art; Leah won third place for her border!

A brief curriculum outline:

Language I haven't quite got to listening to each student read out loud, but I will! From there I will create reading groups that will focus on reading fluency and comprehension. The class is really enjoying our novel study of Holes by L. Sachar. The research reports are almost done, and these will be shared with the class. We will be focusing on writing a friendly letter, a journal entry, and using the "4 Pen" model for answering questions.

Math As a class, the students did quite well with the patterning and algebra unit, even the multiple choice questions! We have started our number sense and numeration unit. The students will be reading large numbers, writing them in expanded and word forms, comparing and ordering

them, and solving problems that require adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing. Keep working on those basic math facts (adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing) at home! Remember to sign and return those weekly times table quizzes, once your child has fixed/completed them!

<u>Science/Social Studies</u> After Thanksgiving we will begin the first Social Studies units. The 5's and 6's will be looking at First Nations and Europeans in New France, focusing on early communities.

<u>Health and Phys. Ed.</u> In phys. ed., we will be working with scoops and lacrosse sticks. In Health, we will continue looking at healthy eating, and what that means for our bodies.

Visual Arts and Drama The students will be selecting and memorizing a poem, and selecting and reading a children's story to the class to develop their skills in expression and timing. The students will have music and dance with Madame Scott!
