Science/Social Studies The 5's and 6's will be finishing up our unit on First Nations and Europeans in New France, focusing on early communities. Part way through November we will return to Science with units on flight and forces acting on structures. We have opportunities for some hands-on learning!

<u>Health and Phys. Ed.</u> In phys. ed., we will be working on volleyball skills and yoga. In Health, we will look at ways to prevent injury, and discuss personal safety.

<u>Visual Arts and Drama</u> The students will be reading a children's story to the class to develop their skills in expression and timing. They will complete their posters for Remembrance Day and develop their skills on the ukelele with Madame Scott!
