

Dress Code Reminder:

As warmer weather approaches, please take a few moments to review the school's dress code with your child(ren). Students, staff and volunteers are required to wear proper attire that displays good taste and demonstrates respect for themselves and others.

- Hats and hoods must be removed inside the school building, except for specified activities such as spirit days. Hair bands are allowed.
- Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times, both inside and outside. Inside shoes are required and shoes with wheels are not allowed on school property.
- Clothing must be appropriate to a school setting and a staff member may ask a student to: phone home for different clothing to be brought to the school or to wear something from the lost and found box if a student is wearing something inappropriate or to turn a t-shirt inside out to wear if it has inappropriate language on it.
- Shirts and tops must be at least waist length and overlap pants/shorts during all activities.
- Shoulder straps on tops must be at least 2 fingers wide (no "spaghetti" straps)
- Necklines, shorts and skirts should fit appropriately and reflect modesty.
- Pajama tops, bottoms and nightshirts are not acceptable clothing at school.
- Appropriate undergarments are necessary and must not be visible.
- Clothing with inappropriate language/graphics or messages (promoting/ depicting drugs, tobacco, alcohol, racist content, sexual content or violence) is unacceptable at all times.
- Flip flop sandals are not permitted while using the playground equipment or swings, nor should they be worn while playing games, like soccer.

Please take the time to clearly label all of your children's clothing, gym outfits and personal belongings. Our Lost and Found box is often full. If you're at the school, please stop in and take a look. At the end of each month all unclaimed items are washed and donated. The school does not accept responsibility for items lost at school.
