Re: ANNA MAE SIMINGTON SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

To celebrate the life of Anna Mae Simington, the Brant Brantford Impaired Driving Committee will award a scholarship valued at \$300.00 in 2010.

Anna Mae Simington, who died suddenly in October of 2006, was a community activist of some note. She founded the Brant Brantford Impaired Driving Committee and co-founded, at a province wide level, the Ontario Community Council on Impaired Driving. Anna Mae also pioneered the development of the "Impaired Drivers Awareness" program which counseled convicted impaired drivers. The Provincial Government later modeled its "Back on Track" program on the one she developed. She had an abiding concern for the victims of crime which culminated in her taking the position of Chair of Victim Services of Brant. She was active in her church, served as a school board trustee and devoted countless hours to other volunteer work.
