WHAT IS AN IPRC?

- The <u>Identification</u>, <u>Placement and Review Committee</u> (IPRC) is a school board committee that decides if;
 The student should be identified as exceptional, based on specific categories and definitions
 Decides an appropriate placement for the student
 Reviews a students identification and placement at least once in each school year.

Ministry of Education Regulation 181/98 governs the IPRC process.

WHAT IS THE CAREGIVER ROLE?

- You will be informed of the IPRC meeting date, location and time at least
- Attend the IPRC meeting. Consider including your child, if appropriate,
- Share information about your child (strengths, interests, medical
- Ask questions about the program or placement being discussed. (I.e. who
- If in agreement, sign the IPRC Statement of Decision within 30 days, or consent is implied



DID YOU KNOW?



- <u>Caregivers can request an IPRC</u> by informing the school principal in writing. An acknowledgement of your request must be given to you in 15 days, and the Principal will let you know in writing approximately when the IPRC will meet and provide a copy or link to the school board's parents' guide to special education.
- You are able to meet with the Principal, LRT and/or classroom teacher prior to the <u>IPRC</u> to explain your rights concerning an IPRC, request any additional information, explain the recommendations, discuss the possible decisions, and answer any
- You may request regular class placement in your neighbourhood school at any time, and this should be considered every year at IPRC Review meetings.
- You can appeal an IPRC decision.
