#### **Updated Elementary Science Curriculum**

In March of this year, the Ministry of Education released a newly updated science and technology curriculum for Grades 1 to 8. Educators will be required to start teaching the revised curriculum in September 2022. It focuses on both STEM skills and fundamental science and technology concepts to reflect the skills students will need to navigate our rapidly changing, scientific and technologically sophisticated world. Our central staff will provide professional development to support the implementation for the Fall of 2022.

#### **New Primary and Junior EQAO Assessment Overview**

This spring, our Grade 3 and 6 students will once again participate in Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) provincial assessments of reading, writing and mathematics after a two-year pause. The format and content have changed considerably, with the most significant changes being digitalization and modernization, leading to a very different student experience.

This year language and math components are divided into four sessions requiring a total of approximately two-to-four hours. Only students attending in-person will participate in the assessments, and EQAO will only report outcomes on students who participate in the assessments.

This year's sample test has been designed to help students familiarize themselves with the digital platform and the new features. Our central staff have created resources and provided PD to administrators, LRTs, Instructional Coaches and teachers to ensure every Grade 3 and 6 student has a positive experience while participating in the EQAO assessments and that they are able to best demonstrate their knowledge, skill and understanding in this newly revised digital format.

### **Ministry Funding for Tutors**

Grand Erie's plan to take advantage of this new opportunity currently spans April to August, and will include:

- Funding for small groups of students to meet with EAs/DECEs before or after school to receive support for homework completion or supplementary literacy and numeracy learning tasks.
- An average group size ratio of 5:1, with five students with one support staff.
- Smaller group size averages, including 1:1 individual tutoring, can be supported for students who would benefit from more attention based on student need, including students with special education needs.
- Additional learning opportunities for students and educators will be enhanced (e.g., summer camps, professional development opportunities)

### **Revised Grade 10 Civics and Citizenship Course, New Grade 9 Science**

The Minister of Education has issued a revised Grade 10 Civics and Citizenship course for September 2022 as part of the government's commitment to modernizing education and preparing students for success beyond the classroom. The Civics and Citizenship course is redesigned to help students learn what it means to be a responsible, informed, and active Canadian citizen, both within the classroom and in the communities they belong to outside of school.

Additionally, the Ministry has issued a new Grade 9 Science course (SNC1W). The course is part of the Ministry's commitment to modernizing education with a renewed focus on science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) and can be accessed on the Curriculum and Resources website. The new de-streamed Grade 9 Science course replaces the existing academic and applied science courses, and will be implemented in classrooms across the province starting in September 2022.

#### Professional Development: Not just a day, but a way

On Friday, April 22, all educators participated in a day of learning titled Not Just a Day, But a Way. This was phase two of Grand Erie's Cultural Competency program, and began with Niigaan Sinclair, Associate Professor at the University of Manitoba. Niigaan supported educators with knowledge of Indigenous culture and provided perspectives on how to include content within the classroom and school.



Following the presentation, educators were shown digital resources and used an Indigenous lens while thinking about their learning environment. The afternoon provided an opportunity to critically learn and reflect on our identities and how they affect and impact teaching practices, ideas and biases. This learning aligned Indigenous perspectives with school improvement planning and culturally relevant and responsive pedagogy.









## BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

#### **Graduation Review**

Data from 2020-21 show a steady to slightly improving four-year graduation rate for high school students in Grand Erie, and a four-per-cent increase in the five-year graduation rate over previous years. Educators are engaging in professional development and deploying new initiatives to help prepare every student for their chosen post-secondary destination, with a focus on gathering and understanding qualitative and quantitative data, as outlined in *Street Data* by Shane Safir and Jamila Dugan. Participation in targeted and innovative programming is increasing, with more than 360 students enrolled in Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Programs, and more than 420 in various Specialist Skills High Major programs.

### **Project SEARCH**

Grand Erie is proud to support Project SEARCH, a 10-month secondary employment preparation program for students with a primary diagnosis of an intellectual or developmental disability who are in their final year of high school. JBLC is hosting an information night on Thursday, May 5 to provide anyone interested with more information on this program to help students reach their employment goals through three co-operative internships at a host business (St. Joseph's Lifecare Centre and Stedman Community Hospice) combined with training in employability and life skills along with employment planning and support.

#### **Additional Items**

**Memorial:** A memorial statement was read to honour Grace McSweeney, a student at Bellview Public School. Grace is remembered as an amazing writer, with a particular talent and appreciation for poetry. She was artistic and hardworking, and used those skills to teach herself to play guitar. She was a great friend and used her sense of humour to keep classmates and staff in good spirits. She was a light to everyone she crossed paths with and will never be forgotten. We want to express our deepest sympathies to Grace's family, her friends and everyone connected to this loss.
