Date	Activity
Monday, May 4	Listen to a piece of music – describe how the music makes you feel. List your feelings.
Tuesday, May 5	Read or listen to a non-fiction book or article. Look for features such as photos, captions, or diagrams. Explain to someone how those things helped you to understand the topic.
Wednesday, May 6	Today is National Nurses Day, create a poster for your window thanking Nurses for their hard work.
Thursday, May 7	What am I? game. Read the following clues to your child have them guess after each clue what they think the object is. I am red. I am crunchy. I am a fruit. See if your child can make one of their own for you to guess.
Friday, May 8	Look out your window or go outside. Find some objects from nature, draw a picture of the object(s) and label the picture with the parts. Extension: do some research on this object, learn 3 new facts about it.

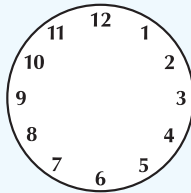

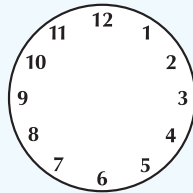

What time is it? Under each activity, draw the hands on the clock to show what time it is:

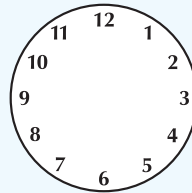
Wake Up



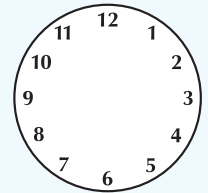
Lunch
