Construction Updates

A status update on major projects happening across Grand Erie was provided, including details of progress and schedules for completion. The Caledonia jointuse elementary school has received Ministry approval to proceed and the tender has been released, with the general construction contract awarded to Tambro Construction Ltd with work now underway. The school is on track to open its doors in September 2025. The South-West Brantford joint-use elementary school also has Ministry approval to proceed, with general construction awarded to Aquicon Construction and work underway. Expected completion is September 2026. The child-care extension at Banbury Heights Elementary School is in progress, with general construction being handled by TRP Construction.



Reflections on Summer Learning

Grand Erie continued to offer rich and engaging learning options this past summer, building on past success and launching new, innovative programs to enhance language, math and technology skills, offer credits, make new connections and prepare for a smooth transition into the 2024-25 school year. Camp SAIL hosted 125 students in grades 2 to 4 across five sites over three weeks working on math



and literacy and engaging games and theme days, providing an educational summer camp environment. Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) hosted skilled trades camps, with nearly 200 students taking part in specialized areas including welding, small engines and hospitality. Additional qualifications courses were offered to educators, with 157 taking part in a variety of curriculum areas. In addition, the Summer Institute supported staff professional development with 240 participants and 21 sessions overall, aligning with Grand Erie's Learning and Operating Plan.

Director's Report Highlights

Grand Beginnings

The first day of school brought students and staff ready to learn, lead and inspire in the year ahead. Director Roberto visited Graham Bell-Victoria Public School and Pauline Johnson Collegiate and Vocational School where the positive energy was high, and social media was abuzz with the same enthusiasm. Safety was also a focus, with Grand Erie partnering with Brantford Police and Fire on hand to ensure the first day, and every day, allows students to put their best feet forward. Four schools were selected



to receive on-site representation from police and first responders this year including Cedarland Public School, King George School, Russell Reid Public School and Walter Gretzky Elementary School.



Summer Facility Improvements

Summer is always a busy time for the Facility Services team. Over the past few months, many upgrade projects were completed including gymnasium improvements at Dunnville Secondary School and Jarvis Public School, learning commons completions at Brier Park Public School and Grand Erie Learning Alternatives, and dozens of other projects across the district.

Supporting Safety

Once again, Grand Erie is pleased to support the Children's Safety Village of Brant. Over the years, this charitable foundation has provided thousands of learners with hands-on personal safety training and school safety patroller training.
