Guidance:

- ▶ Timetable changes went smoothly for semester 2
- ▶ Ms. Stromme visited 7 feeder schools: 152 incoming Grade 9's, 32 in Extended French
- ▶ Equity and inclusion presentation with students; working on actionable items moving forward to increase education and awareness

Provincial Testing:

- ▶ EQAO Math School Improvement Plan (SIP): goal is for 50% of our grade 9 students to achieve Level 3. As of end of semester one, 47% of SCS students earned a level 3. 3 grade 9 MTH1W classes writing in June; SIP strategies include math coaches plus PD for all teachers
- ▶ OSSLT: 70% pass rate, opportunity in April to write again for those that did not pass, course available as alternative to test
