Student Recognition

The recognition program is Grand Erie's way of honouring and celebrating students who have excelled in academics, arts, athletics or community involvement. On Monday, Nicole Kelly, a Grade 12 student from Brantford Collegiate Institute and Vocational School, was presented with a certificate from Trustee Carol Ann Sloat and Director of Education Brenda Blancher.

Nicole Kelly – Brantford Collegiate Institute and Vocational School – Athletics

Nicole Kelly is a world champion in the sport of hockey. Last year, the Grade 12 student donned the maple leaf jersey for the first time as one of 23 players on Canada's Under-18 women's hockey team.

In January, she was named to the team to compete at the International Ice Hockey Federation's Under-18 Women's World Championship in Japan. There, the team defeated the United States 3-2 in overtime, earning gold for Canada.

During her secondary school career, Nicole has balanced the gruelling training schedule required of an international-caliber athlete, while earning a reputation for her sense of integrity, responsibility, respect, and cooperation.
