## Antivity

Create a mini poster that advertises a place you have been to or would like to go to. Be sure to include a detailed picture, a title and information about why someone would want to visit there.

Create a 4 to 6 -frame comic strip based on a topic of choice. Draw pictures and use speech and thought bubbles to show what the characters are saying and thinking.
