Grand Erie values languages and home cultures. We invite all our families and students to complete some of these activities in English, French, or their own first/home language.

Activity

Monday, June 15

Choose a happy memory to talk or write about. Include who was with you, what you were doing, when it was, where you were, and any other important details like smells, sounds and how you felt.

Tuesday, June 16

Play "Famous Pairs" with a partner. You say part of a famous pair (e.g. Mickey) and your partner will try to guess the other part (e.g. Minnie). Next time, let your partner go first.

Some ideas might be; peanut butter and jelly, bacon and eggs, pancakes and syrup, Anna and Elsa, Batman and Robin, bat and ball, stick and puck, salt and pepper, etc.

Wednesday, June 17

Today is National Eat Your Vegetables Day. Try to convince someone why they should eat their vegetables. Be sure to use full sentences.

Thursday, June 18

If you could be an actor/actress in any movie, play, or story you wanted, what character would you choose? Why? Write 3-5 sentences.

Friday, June 19

If there was one book or movie you would recommend to a friend to either read or watch this summer what would it be? Explain three reasons why you think your friend would love it.

Monday, June 15

Skip Counting! Pretend you skip count by a number, and you say 20 while skip counting. What number might you have been skip counting by? What numbers were you not skip counting by? How do you know? Ask someone at home this question, did they skip count by the same number as you?

Tuesday, June 16

Compare capacity! Remember, capacity is how much a container can hold. Find 4 or 5 empty containers of different sizes at home (e.g., an empty soup can, a pail, a Tupperware container etc.). Predict which container can hold the most water (has the largest capacity) and which can hold the least (has the smallest capacity). Test it out! Use a small cup to fill each container with water. Keep count of how many cups it took to fill each container. Order your containers by capacity, from the container holding the least amount of water to the container holding the most.

Wednesday, June 17

Symmetry. A line of symmetry is an imaginary line on a shape. If we fold the shape on the line, the two parts will match exactly. Look at the yellow triangle. If we folded it on the red line, the two parts will match up.

Now you try! Where is a line of symmetry on the following LETTERS? (Hint! Some letters have more than one line of symmetry!)

Which pattern is a growing pattern? How do you know?



Choose 2 sets of objects from your home. Make your own growing pattern.

Friday, June 19

There is 1 orange, 2 bananas and 4 apples. If these pieces of fruit were put into a bag, which type of fruit will most likely be pulled out? Which type of fruit will be unlikely to pull out? How do you know?



Put it to the test! Find a bag or a hat that you can put some items into. Put in 4 of one item, 2 of another, and 1 of something else – it does not have to be fruit, you could use blocks, beads, coins, marbles etc. Reach in and pull out an object. What did you get? Is it what you expected to get?
