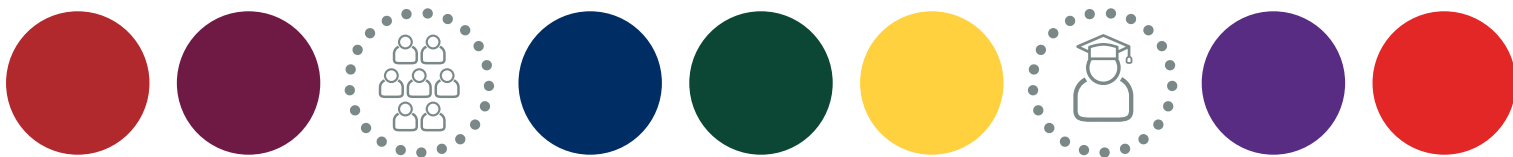


# Resource Guide Fall 2020

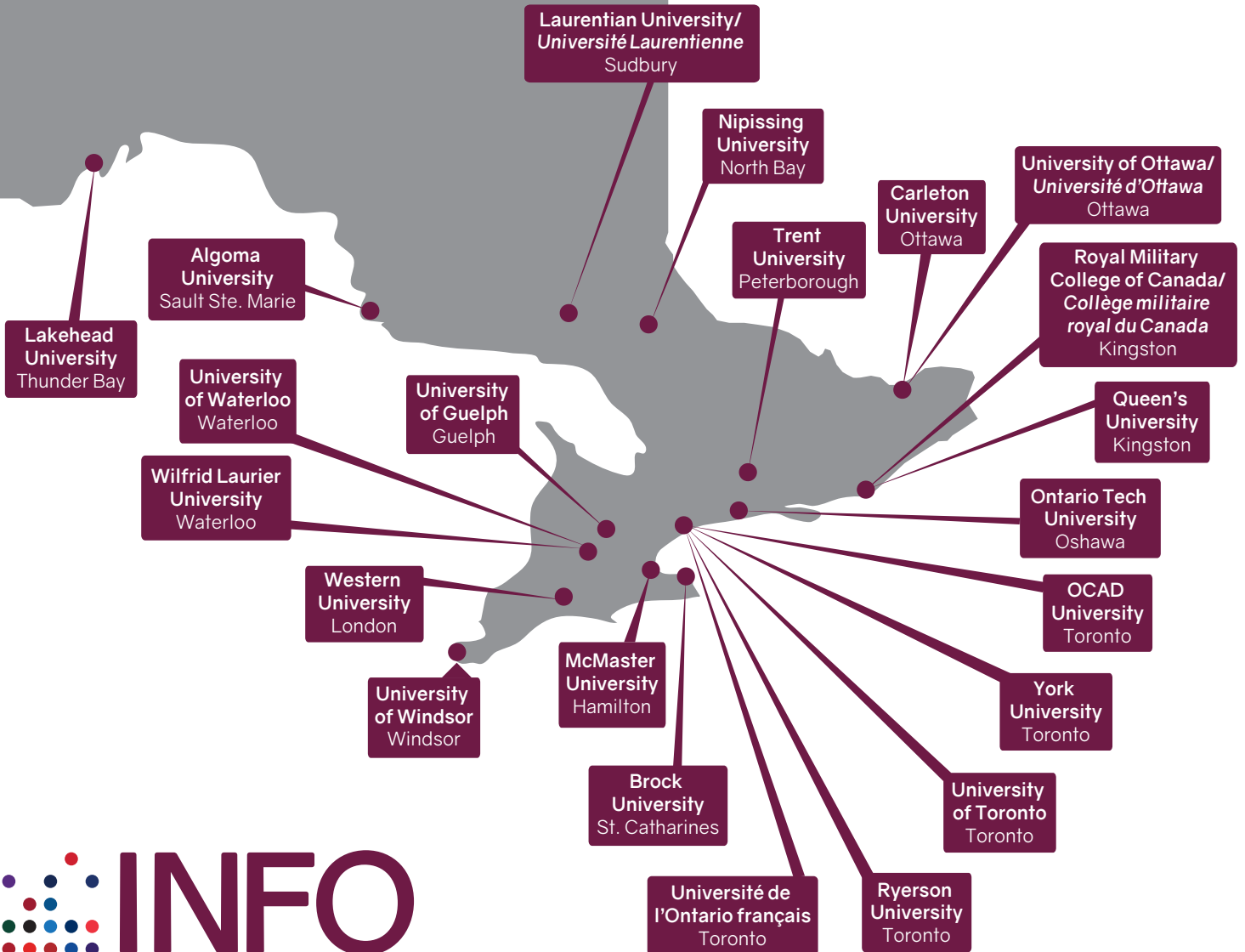

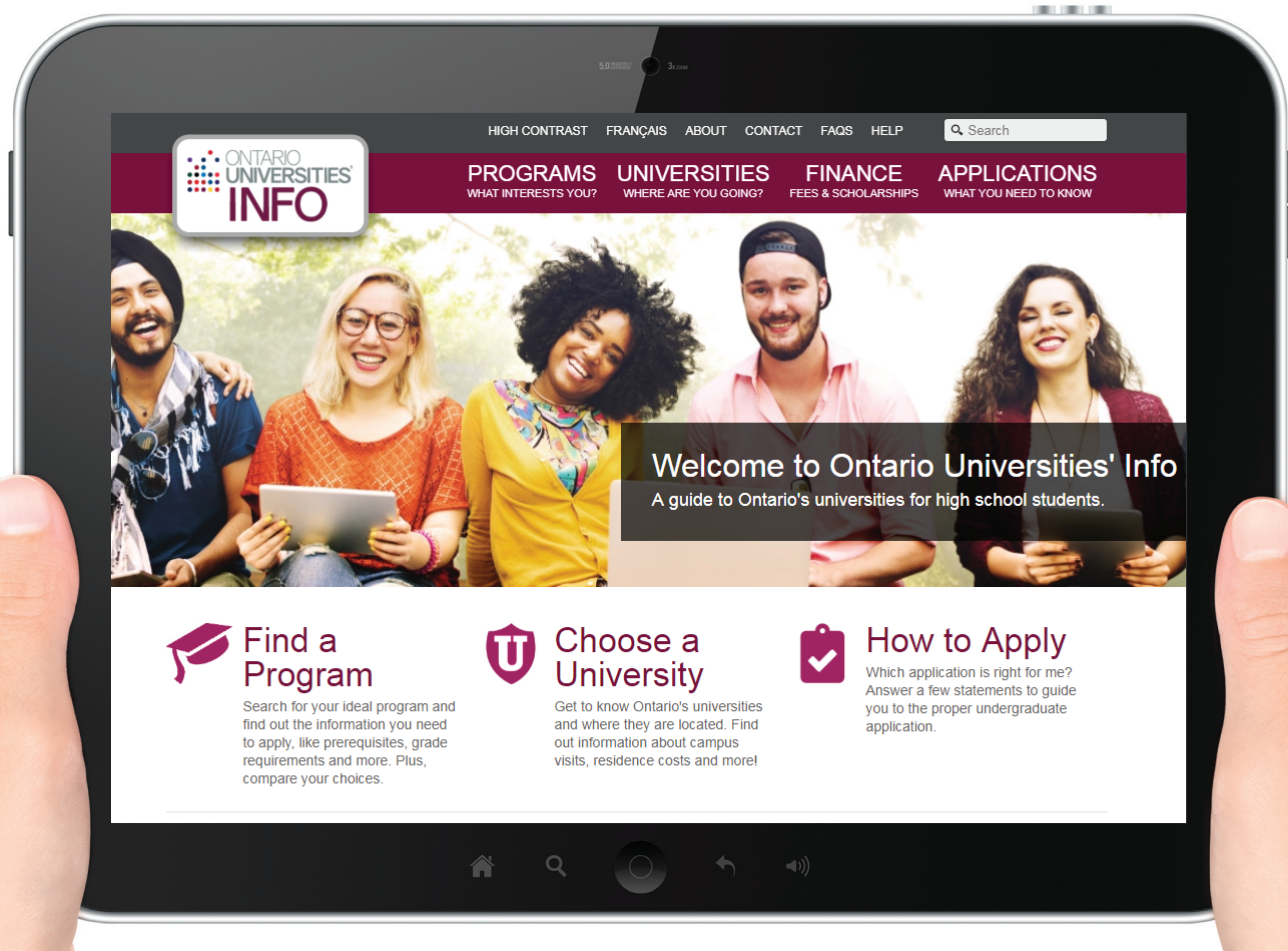
