13 July 2021 We say NO to the "New Normal" for children

This letter is to School boards, Trustees, Principals, Public Health Officials, MPs, MPPs, MLAs, Ministries and Ministers of Health, Ministries and Ministers of Education, Premiers and Prime Minister.

We are a strong group of parents, grandparents, concerned citizens and professionals who are committed to advocating for the children of Canada against the "New Normal" continuing to be imposed.

Over the last 18 months, children have been made to carry the weight of the world and have been forced to endure completely unnecessary restrictions and abuse. Collectively, we say NO to masking, distancing, poisonous chemical sanitizer, isolation, testing, constant coercion and violation of bodily autonomy, and unproven injections. We say NO to ignoring our children's suffering, to putting their needs to the side and their lives in harms way all in the name of "health and safety" and "the greater good." Our children are the most vulnerable members of society and the most valuable. We will not let their voices go unheard, we will no longer comply.

Please see the following main points:

1. NO TO LOCKDOWNS

The most staggering statistics that have come out of the past year have been the levels of childhood suicides (now the number 1 cause of death for children), depression, anxiety, eating disorders, overdoses, and abuse. These harms have been directly caused by the isolation of lockdowns and the closing of important resources. According to SickKids Hospital, more than half of children aged 8-12 reported clinically significant depressive symptoms during the 2nd wave of the pandemic. That number jumped to 70% among adolescents. There have also been an unprecedented rise in hospital admissions for eating disorders and Type 2 diabetes. These figures alone should be enough to stop the harmful measures.

It has been well documented and proven globally that children are statistically at 0% risk of dying from Covid-19. Data from across the world, including Canada, shows that not only are children not seriously affected by this virus, they also do not spread it. In fact, children are at far more risk of serious outcomes from seasonal influenza than from Covid. Despite these facts, children have been forced to accept harmful rules and restrictions under the guise of public safety. These mandates have and continue to affect them socially, emotionally and physically. What we know is that there is no justifiable reason to take away youth sports or to isolate them away from their family and friends or to close down parks and playgrounds or to deny access to schools and co-op placements and force them in front of a screen. What we know is that the above causes a great deal of unnecessary distress to children and youth. We as a collective group will not accept any further locking down of these essential parts of life and liberty that each and every citizen in Canada was born with the innate right to.

2. NO TO MASKING AND DISTANCING

The daily messaging regarding masking and distancing can be seen everywhere you turn. The propaganda in stores, on TV, on the radio, on social media and within the classroom has had a clear message to our children. The message is to fear the air they breathe and the people and objects around them. They have been told by peers, adults and teaching staff that they now have the power to kill their loved ones just by breathing air and having physical contact, or that the mask is the only way to keep themselves and others safe despite any discomfort they feel or any exemptions they may have. The damage and trauma done with this messaging can be irreversible! Masking is particularly harmful for our youngest children as they develop and learn. Children need to be able to see facial expressions and interact through play and touch in order to form healthy social connections, learn to read and speak, and feel secure in their world. Not only is masking unhealthy psychologically, it is physically hazardous. A fully peer-reviewed study published in The Journal of American Medicine

(https://jamanetwork.com/journals/jamapediatrics/fullarticle/2781743) showed that after just 3 minutes of mask wearing, children were found to be inhaling over 6 to 10 times the exposure limit of carbon dioxide. This is TOXIC! With this type of exposure, children have been experiencing several symptoms of toxicity including: headaches, difficulty breathing, fatigue, loss of concentration and more. A German study of over 25,000 children also confirms these types of adverse events due to masking.

In April 2021, Health Canada set the indoor exposure limit for CO2 at 1,000 ppm. With

the knowledge that children are breathing in toxic levels of CO2 for upwards of 8 hours per day, indoors and outdoors and during phys-ed; we can no longer allow this to occur! In addition to the toxic air, the masks themselves, after long-term wear in this type of setting have been shown to become a breeding ground for harmful bacteria and pathogens. The warm, wet environment within the mask creates an unsafe level of risk to the wearer as he/she is continuously exposed to this as well as causes the break down of mask material which can be inhaled. Even with a change of mask, children are not mature enough nor should they be required to worry about keeping themselves and a mask sterile. These are unrealistic and dangerous expectations that are leading to serious harm.

3. NO TO DANGEROUS INJECTIONS

The new Covid-19 injections are only Authorized for Emergency Use. They are not Approved by FDA or Health Canada. There is no long term safety data at all for any age group. With the recent roll-out for children as young as 12 and the impending roll-out for children under the age of 12, we refuse to be coerced, bribed or forced to take part in these experimental injections in order to gain access to education, activities, extra curriculars and social contact. If you are told you have to take some drug in order to regain your freedoms, then you are NOT free!

As documented by Pfizer, Moderna, Astrazeneca and J&J, the experimental phase is not complete until 2023. As per the Nuremberg Code, our families have the right to refuse to participate in such an experiment. INFORMED CONSENT is non negotiable. These injections have not been proven safe, in fact they have show an extremely high rate of adverse reactions and deaths as seen in Government adverse event data collection systems in several countries. There have been more reported deaths and reactions caused by these injections in the last several months than for all vaccines in the last 3 decades combined!

Reports of Myocarditis, Pericarditis (especially among boys), menstrual cycle disruptions, fertility concerns, blood clots, neurological conditions and death INCLUDING child deaths are coming out all over the world. According to the CDC's own data, children aged 0-17 are at 11.3 times greater risk of injury due to Covid-19 injection in comparison to any benefit that may come from taking the shot. Schools and governments that willingly participate in medical coercion will be held liable.

Families that choose to not inject their children will not allow their child to be treated any differently via segregation, masking, plexiglass or other, in any setting. Children are not to be excluded or have their private medical information divulged. Medical Privacy Laws state that consent must not be required as a condition of service. The Health Care Consent Act Section 11 outlines consent must be voluntary and informed.

To summarize our message: Our children have the right to an education free from fear and stress and free from restrictions and suppression. Our children have the right to have their voices heard and their needs put before our own as adults. Our children have the right to a full life with normal experiences and new milestones that will shape them into healthy, happy and confident adults. The path that we are currently on is going to have serious impacts that reach far into the future. We need to end these harmful measures today as that would be following true science and true evidence that we have had over a year to look back on. It is our duty as adults to do what is right for our children. It is OUR duty to protect them from harm, not the other way around.

Update 16 July 2021 Continued censorship

The Journal of American Medicine has been forced to print a retraction on the mask study quoted in our letter. This truly solidifies the continued censorship and unwillingness to accept any counter debate on science. The underpinning of valid science is to hear the debate on both sides, not censor it or cancel it.

Our children's experiences show what the truth is. That cannot be censored.

THAT the Grand Erie District School Board approve the contract for the supply and lease of multifunction devices for all Board locations from **Ricoh Canada Inc**. in the amount of an estimated annual cost of \$429,263.77 plus HST.

Background

Board is able to participate in an agreement with Ricoh Canada Inc. though the Ministry of Government and Consumer Services (MGCS) for the lease of 225 Multifunction Devices for a 60-month lease term. The lease term will begin November 2021 and is expected to conclude in October 2026. The features described in this report summarize the wants and needs from the working group that reviewed our existing devices. This working group included personnel from both central administration and school administration.

The costs for each unit per month are listed in the table below:

Based off the number of impressions from the 2018-2019 school year, the estimated annual contract price is as follows:

The above pricing is significantly lower than the amount that is being paid now on a per copy basis. Currently colour copies are \$0.0589 while black and white cost \$0.01150.

Although the new cost of the devices is \$24,567 higher than the existing contract, the devices are newer, offer better features and are much easier to use (according to those that tested the machines).

In addition, the cost of the contract can be reduced by reducing copies. Grand Erie has continued to incorporate best practices to reduce the volume of printing. These strategies include:

- Using PDF software to manage documents
- Double-sided printing or printing portions of documents
- Emailing documents where possible
- Using technology and projectors

An 11% reduction in copies from the numbers provided above would reduce the cost of the new contract to the level of the existing one. This is attainable if schools continue to use the best practices to guide their printing.

Additional Information

The existing contract would also standardize all units across the system and the following features would be included:

IM C4500 – Colour Laser Multifunction Printer

- Internal finisher (reduced carbon footprint)
- Stapler Unit
- Hole Punch Unit
- Prints up to 45ppm (pages per minute)
- Scans up to 240 images per minute

PapercutMF. a user management solution, would also permit the following features to be included as part of the roll out:

- Controls to print costs print rules (no colour), quota controls, group rules
- Secure Print users will be required to use their Board issued ID badges to access their print jobs
- Users can access devices at any board location
- Sends scans from persons email, rather than the unit's serial number

Next Steps

Over the next six to eight weeks, the Board's Purchasing Department will conduct a thorough analysis of existing devices across the system to ensure the correct number of devices are deployed. There are some instances where a new machine will replace two older ones.

It is anticipated that a phased-in approach will be implemented, as coordination between the new vendor, the existing vendor, schools and the Purchasing department will be required.

Training will be provided through either online materials, videos or on-site instruction. The devices are "super easy" to use and we anticipate that our system will experience efficiencies with respect to many office processes.

September 2021

Background

The Grand Erie District School Board promotes and supports the well-being and safety of all students. As per the Ministry of Education's document "Guide to Reopening Ontario's Schools" released in the fall of 2020, and the Addendum to the reopening guidance document, "Guide to Reopening Ontario's Schools" released in January 2021, mandatory masking will be in place for students in Grades 1 to 12 indoors in school, including in hallways and during classes, as well as on school vehicles. The Grand Erie District School Board has also mandated masking for students in the Kindergarten Program, following the same guidelines as outlined above.

On August 13, 2021, the Ministry released "Covid-19: Health, safety and operation guidance for schools (2021-22)". This document clarifies that students are not required to wear masks outdoors, but distancing should be encouraged between cohorts as much as possible.

Both masks and face shields are types of personal protective equipment (PPE). Measures that are used for *source control* attempt to prevent the spread of infection from the wearer to those around them. Source control can include covering your sneezes and coughs, hand hygiene, and wearing a mask in public. Masks are both used for source control and to protect oneself from others (as PPE). Cloth masks are for source control and higher-grade disposable masks are for both for source control and PPE. Face shields are considered PPE but are not meant to function as a primary device for respiratory protection. To date, there is no evidence that face shields alone are effective either as source control or as PPE but are effective to augment other more effective PPE.

Public Health Ontario does not recommend the use of face shields as a substitute for cloth face coverings. Although face shields would not replace masks, in some cases, face shields, in combination with other protective measures, may be considered an appropriate accommodation.

The Grand Erie District School Board recognizes that there are some students with medical restrictions that may require the student to attend school without the use of a mask. Reasonable accommodations, up to and including exemptions, will be permitted for some students. Parents/guardians are encouraged to consult their physician for guidance about a mask accommodation/exemption for their child, if necessary, however a physician note is not required for a student mask accommodation/exemption under the following situations that are previously known to the school:

- □ child with a medical or cognitive condition that prevents wearing a mask (severe sensory processing disorder, cognitive impairment, longstanding agoraphobia, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder triggered by a face covering),
- □ child unable to apply or remove a face covering without help
- □ children less than 5 years of age (cognitively or developmentally) who refuse to wear a face covering and cannot be persuaded to

- Citizenship •

- Place of origin
- Creed

- Disability • Family status
- Marital status (including single status)

We note that discomfort or acne would generally not constitute a basis for NOT wearing a mask.

School Procedure

- (a) The parent/guardian contacts the principal/designate to request an accommodation/exemption for their child.
- (b) The parent/guardian completes the Parent Application Form (Appendix A) and returns it to principal/designate.
- (c) The principal/designate reviews the mask accommodation/exemption request with the parent/guardian. (The principal/designate will review if there are any solutions other than a complete exemption such as frequent breaks, only wearing during certain activities, avoiding during exertion, gradual build up to full day masking, if allergy, provide a different one. Such options should be considered before a complete exemption will be considered.) While the request is being considered, the student will be expected to follow the policy laid out by the Ministry of Education or the Board of Trustees.
- (d) The school provides the Principal Response Form (Appendix B) to parent/guardians.
- (e) The principal/designate communicates the mask accommodation/exemption outcome to school staff and transportation services.
- (f) The principal/board reserves the right to ask further questions or request more information and to modify its decision as may be needed for the health and safety of others.
- (g) The school will provide masks to students at school who require them.

Appendix A

Student Accommodation, up to and Including Exemption, from Non-Medical or Cloth Masks

Policy Statement:

The Grand Erie District School Board (the "Board") is committed to ensuring that its actions and operations are performed, with transparency, to the extent permitted by law, accountability, honesty, and integrity.

To that end this policy imposes a duty on every Board employee, independent contractor, agent and volunteer to Report, in confidence, any reasonable knowledge or suspicion of wrongdoing as defined herein. If warranted, the alleged wrongdoing will be investigated, and appropriate action will be taken on the report of the investigation. This Policy is also available without obligation, to anyone, and in particular students of the Board, past or present, who believe they have been victim to sexual misconduct by a Board employee or volunteer.

This Policy establishes that any person or legal entity reporting any wrongdoing reasonably and in good faith, ("Reporting Party ") shall not be subject to any reprisal as defined herein.

For greater clarity, the role and relationships between the Board and the Reporting Party shall not, in any way be adversely affected by any Report made pursuant to this Policy reasonably and in good faith.

The Reporting of suspected Wrongdoing of Trustees of the Board is not included by this Policy. Bylaw 28, Trustee Code of Conduct, applies in those circumstances.

Definitions

1. WRONGDOING

Any action or inaction, past, present, or intended by a Board employee, independent contractor, agent and volunteer which is contrary or prohibited by any Federal or Provincial Legislation, or Regulations enacted thereunder, Common Law, or Municipal Bylaw.

It also includes but is not limited to:

- a) Professional Misconduct as defined by relevant Professional Organizations;
- b) Intentional breach of Board Policies, Practices and Procedures;
- c) Instructing, counselling or extorting anyone to commit an act of wrongdoing;
- d) Statutory or Common Law Conflicts of Interest;
- e) Mismanagement or maladministration of Board operations;
- f) Dishonest or unethical behaviour; and
- g) Sexual misconduct of any nature or description.

2. REPRISAL

Any action, inaction or threat of any such action or inaction against a Reporting Party by reason of a Report made under this Policy, including but not limited to:

- a) employment status;
- b) working conditions;
- c) legal relationship with the Board;
- d) discipline; and
- e) threats, intimidation or bullying.

PROCEDURE

Smoke–Free Environment

September 2021

Accountability:

- 1. Frequency of Reports As needed
- 2. Criteria for Success Board property is smoke-free at all times

Procedures:

The Grand Erie District School Board believes in providing a healthy work and learning environment for employees and students.

To this end, all Board properties and vehicles are designated as smoke–free at all times. Smoking on Board property or in Board vehicles will be dealt with through the Board's progressive discipline procedure (HR119) and the Code of Conduct of individual schools.

Medical marijuana – under the following controlled conditions – is allowed to be smoked on Board property.

- There must be a personal prescription (signed by a physician or nurse practitioner) specifically for medical marijuana. A copy of the prescription will be kept on file.
- There must be a specific dosage prescribed.
- The physician must indicate that the medical marijuana has to be administered during the school/workday.
- The physician must indicate the form in which the medical marijuana will be used. Smoke free options are preferred; however, if smoking is the only option, there are commercial devices that restrict the amount of second-hand smoke.
- Proof of a personal license to use marijuana must be presented to the Principal/Supervisor. A copy of the license will be kept on file.
- Proof of an authorized marijuana supplier must be provided. A copy of this documentation will be kept on file.

Under the Electronic Cigarette Act (2015), the use of e-cigarettes (vaping) is illegal wherever smoking is already prohibited.

The Grand Erie District School Board will ensure compliance with all relevant aspects of the "Smoke–Free Ontario Act – 2006".

2. Criteria for Success – Appropriate safety precautions are taken.

Equipment and training provided for all staff.

Procedures:

These procedures outline precautions applying to <u>any</u> staff involved in the care and the handling of individuals when blood and other body fluids are present.

Although the risk of contracting blood-borne infections through occupational exposure is very low, these infections are a reality when dealing with Hepatitis "B" (HBV), Human Immune-Deficiency Virus positive serology (HIV), Hepatitis C Virus (HCV) and other potential infections. Staff who may be exposed to blood and other body fluids should take appropriate precautions to minimize direct contact.

1. <u>Responsibility</u>:

Principals/supervisors have the responsibility to ensure that their staff are aware of the precautions and safe practices regarding blood-borne infections.

2. <u>Precautions</u>:

In order to minimize direct contact with blood and body fluids, the following general precautions are suggested for all situations where blood or body fluids are encountered:

- a) *Hand washing*: Hands (and any skin surface) must be washed thoroughly as soon as practicable. To wash hands, use plain soap and vigorously rub together all surfaces of lathered hands for at least twenty seconds. Rinse thoroughly under a stream of water. Cuts or sores on hands should also be covered with a waterproof dressing.
- b) *Gloves*: New, disposable waterproof vinyl gloves (or nitrile) should be worn when in contact with blood, blood products, other body fluids, open wounds or sores (non-intact skin) and items or surfaces soiled with blood or other body fluids. If gloves are punctured or cut they should be removed as soon as practicable. <u>Schools will provide gloves for all staff who are involved.</u>

Procedures for Using Gloves:

- i) Put on gloves, making sure they cover cuffs if long sleeves are worn.
- ii) After using gloves, remove them by hooking gloved fingers of dominant hand into lower outside edge of the other glove. Pull the glove inside out as you remove it and then hold the glove in your gloved hand.
- iii) Tuck your ungloved hand into the inside of the remaining glove. Remove that glove by pulling it inside out and encase the other glove as you do so.
- iv) Dispose of gloves immediately in waste disposal.
- v) Wash hands thoroughly after removal of gloves.

Staff unfamiliar with gloving procedures are advised to contact the Health and Safety Office.

c) *Pocket Masks or Other Ventilation Devices*: These can be purchased for those settings where the need for resuscitation can be anticipated. However, the risk of infection is so slight that no one should hesitate to give mouth-to-mouth resuscitation if such equipment is not available. Employees must be adequately trained in the use of such equipment.

3. <u>Clean-up of Spills and Contaminated Surfaces</u>:

Spills of blood or other body fluids and contaminated surfaces should be cleaned promptly with detergent and water, using disposable towels. The area should then be disinfected with a disinfectant cleaning product and left to dry. Chemical germicides approved for use as hospital disinfectants can also be used. The Material Safety Data Sheet for the product must be checked before use and all safety precautions followed.

4. <u>Waste Disposal</u>:

- a) Sharp Devices and Glass (needles, syringes, broken glass, sharp devices or instruments):
 - should be placed in disposable, puncture-resistance containers;
 - prior to disposal, puncture resistant containers should be securely sealed and the contents identified with a label or tag;
 - schools may be able to arrange for disposal through hospitals in the community;
 - if in doubt, call the Health and Safety Office.
- b) Solid Wastes (ie. disposable articles and dressings):
 - should be placed in a sturdy impervious (plastic) bag, tied securely with a twist tie and the contents identified with a label or tag;
 - double bagging is necessary only if the outside of the bag is contaminated with blood or other body fluids, or if there is potential for leakage;
 - dispose with regular garbage in a secure sanitary landfill or have incinerated.
- c) Unclotted Blood and Other Body Fluids:
 - dispose into a drain connected to a sanitary sewer and flush with water.
- d) Soiled Clothing:
 - clothing which has been soiled with blood or other body fluids may be washed with regular laundry;
 - soiled linen and clothing should be handled as little as possible;
 - linen and clothing which have been heavily soiled with blood or other body fluids should be transported in bags that prevent leakage, and be tagged indicating the contents.

5. What to do if Exposure Occurs:

- a) where there has been contact or splashes of blood or other body fluids on the skin, the area should be thoroughly washed as soon as practicable with soap and water;
- b) splashes of mucosa membranes such as the lips, mouth, eyes or nose, should be flushed with water as soon as practicable;
- c) clothing which becomes soiled with blood or other body fluids should be removed as soon as practicable;
- d) penetrating wounds such as needle/stick punctures or cuts from sharp objects should be encouraged to bleed and then washed thoroughly with soap and water; medical attention should be sought as soon as possible if exposure to a biological or chemical agent is suspected.
- e) penetrating wounds or splashes onto mucous membrane or non-intact skin should be reported to the employee's principal/supervisor. An Accident Form should also be completed following the incident.

If blood enters an open cut or sore on your hands, etc., wash thoroughly and proceed to the nearest hospital emergency for follow-up for HBV, HCV, and HIV, preferably within one to two hours of exposure

f) Employees who are exposed should complete an EMPLOYEE INJURY INCIDENT DISEASE REPORT and submit it to Human Resources through the Staff Portal so that the event can be documented with the WSIB

6. <u>Giving First Aid to Any Person</u>:

- a) Where feasible, wash your hands first.
- b) Always:
 - i) wear disposable gloves, especially if you have any open cuts, sores, etc. on the hands;
 - ii) wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water after giving the first aid;
 - iii) if blood enters an open cut or sore on your hands, etc., wash thoroughly and proceed to the nearest hospital emergency for follow-up for HBV, HCV, and HIV, preferably within one to two hours of exposure;
 - iv) after wiping up spilled blood with a paper towel, etc., wipe the surface with a disinfectant cleaning product and allow to air dry;
 - v) soiled gloves, towels, etc. should be placed in a plastic or paper bag and discarded in the waste disposal.

Reporting Suspected Wrongdoing

The Report

 Unless as otherwise provided herein Reports of reasonable knowledge or reasonable suspicion of wrongdoing shall be made promptly to the Director or person designated by the Director to receive and act on such Reports. The Director may designate a Senior Board Official or an external Third Party for this purpose. Reports of sexual misconduct may be made orally or in writing to <u>Superintendent of Human Resources</u>

Content and Anonymous Report

- 2. The Report shall be sent in writing or in electronic form and shall contain the information set out in schedule "A" herein;
- 3. Reports of sexual misconduct may be made orally or in writing to the person designated in section 1 above.
- 4. The Director or designate may decline to investigate an anonymous Report.
- 5. The Report and the identity of the Reporting Party shall not be disclosed unless required by law;

Assessment by Director

- 6. Upon receipt of the Report the Director or designate shall assess it to determine:
 - a) Whether it is made in good faith, is frivolous, vexatious and satisfies the definition of Wrongdoing;
 - b) Whether another legal authority should receive and investigate the Report. For example, Reports of suspected criminal activity should be reported immediately to the Police;
 - c) Whether the Report is already the subject of a legal proceeding or should be processed by another appropriate statutory authority;
 - d) Whether the matter involves employment or labour relations matters and can be addressed by other means;
 - e) In all of the circumstances, whether the matter should be addressed by other means;
- 7. Where the Director or designate confirms any of the factors set out in 5 exists no investigation of the Report should be undertaken and the Reporting Party will be informed accordingly.

Investigation

- 8. Where the Director or designate decides an investigation of the reported Wrongdoing is warranted it shall be carried out without delay adhering to principles of fairness and in accordance with relevant Board Policies and Procedures; Whenever appropriate the Investigation should be conducted by an independent third party;
- 9. As part of the investigation the alleged wrongdoer will be provided with the substance of the Wrongdoing allegations and given a reasonable opportunity to respond.
- 10. All documentation of any kind generated by an investigation or any other action taken under this Procedure is confidential and shall be securely retained by appropriate Board officials;
- 11. Where the Report alleges Wrongdoing on the Part of the Director, it shall immediately be referred to an independent third party for processing under this Procedure. The Report of any investigation under this part shall be made to the Chair of the Board.

Receipt of Investigative Report

12. Upon receipt of the report of the investigation under section 7. above, the Director or designate

shall determine whether any disciplinary action is warranted, any law enforcement or professional authorities should be notified, to what extent the Reporting Party can be informed of the results of the investigation and whether any other action should be taken;

Obstruction

13. Anyone who intentionally interferes with or obstructs any investigation undertaken under this Procedure shall be subject to appropriate discipline and/or other available legal sanctions;

Reprisal

14. Any person who commits or attempts to commit any act of reprisal as defined by Policy F7 shall be subject to appropriate discipline and/or available legal sanctions;

Report to Board

15. The Director or Chair of the Board, as the case may be, shall Report to the Board annually on all investigations of Reports of Wrongdoings;
