| B. Principal's Report | Principal's Report - Oct 4, 2021: <br> Since last meeting, staff and students participated in two memorable school events! Its so good to experience a couple of whole-school, face-to-face events!! Sept 29 was Toonie for Terry where students ran/walked/jogged the rack during a 45 minute period. Many classes did this with their learning buddies. Some students wore "Terry Ran for Us, I'm running for $\qquad$ "signs on their shirt. Unlike previous years where staff and volunteers punched a paper eard of each participant to count the laps, students kept track in their head. Approximately $\$ 1200$ was donated by families and will be forwarded to the Terry Fox Foundation. Throughout the week of Sept 27, teachers presented eadings, poems, discussions, videos and podcasts to move our thinking forward related to residential schools, the Indigenous experience during and after North American colonization, Indigenous Land rights, and Reconciliation. Materials were provided to all schools by our school board's Indigenous Education Department. One of our Grade 2 eachers, Mme Dubinsky organized all the resources and developed a plan for the staff. On Sept 30, the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation which also was Orange shirt day, we went outside after second recess after hearing some important though-provoking words over the announcements. Each class had made a banner Every child matters, Truth and reconciliation, Chaque Enfant Compte, etc.) along with individual student thoughts narked on a handprint, a feather, or a heart. Once we took a picture of our student/staff, young classes actively walked as distinct groups on the track led by a representative holding their banner. Older classes walked down St George Street down to Dover Cliffs then toward Main Street where they continued down the sidewalk back toward he school. It was a beautiful day, with much support from neighbours, and vehicles passing by honking their horn n support. We felt that this first big step of actively doing something would stand out in the minds of the students as we all, as Canadians, continue to actively work toward Reconciliation. Its not enough for us as Canadians to support reconciliation by thinking about it. We need to work on reconciliation by doing. Many thanks to Mme Dubinsky for putting together such an effective group of activities for the students and staff. Anyone, Anywhere can |
