The Indigenous Peoples Atlas Floor Map of Canada resource will assist you, and your students, in understanding the past, present and future of Indigenous Peoples in Canada. There is a wealth of information, and a diversity of stories and voices, on this map.

The Map is large (11 meters x 8 meters), so you will need access to a large space, such as a gym, to spread out the map.

The Activity Kit includes a teacher's guide, and associated materials and activities that are appropriate for students in grades 1 - 12. There is a French language resource available.

Our Board has three maps that can be shared with schools. The map will be loaned out for two weeks at a time, and there is a sign out sheet on the Indigenous Education PLE.











EVERYBODY NEEDS A ROCK
