French Immersion Review

Beginning this June, in an effort to further enhance French Immersion programming for Grand Erie students, a review of the current program will be conducted by a French Immersion Ad Hoc committee.

Facilitated by the Superintendent of Program K-12, with the responsibility for the oversight of the K-12 French Immersion program, the Ad Hoc committee will meet for a minimum of two meetings between June and October 2022. Focus groups will be created to provide feedback to the committee regarding entry points, the randomized selection process, capacity pressures, automatic sibling placements procedure, and student transition and retention from elementary to secondary programs. Findings and recommendations will be presented to the Senior Executive team for further review and a final report will be presented to the Board of Trustees later in 2022.

Ryerson Heights School Renaming Update

In June 2021, Grand Erie's Board of Trustees approved the request for renaming Ryerson Heights Elementary School. Moving forward to break the connection between the legacy of Egerton Ryerson and Grand Erie's vision and mission, and in accordance with Policy FT3 Naming of Schools, the process sought community input for a 60-day period ending January 17, 2022. A total of 250 submissions were considered by the Renaming Committee, and on March 29, the Renaming Committee proposed three new names for consideration by Trustees:

- Edith Monture Elementary School
- Pleasant Ridge Elementary School
- Tom Longboat Elementary School

Pending confirmation at the next full Board meeting, Trustees selected **Edith Monture Elementary School** as the new name. The new name will be circulated to all stakeholder groups. Grand Erie Secondary Students Recognized for Outstanding Achievements


The past couple of weeks has seen a number of secondary students achieving significant recognition for success across a range of disciplines.
