Cultural Event - Shrove Tuesday

During first block (9:15 to 10) on Tuesday, February 17th, a pancake will be given to every student to enjoy. The Sherwood restaurant is catering for us this year.

So.. what is Shrove Tuesday?

Also known as Pancake Tuesday or Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday marks the beginning of Lent. Certain Christian religions fast during the 40 days between Shrove Tuesday and Good Friday. Fasting in this instance is giving

up foods that are considered "rich" like butter, eggs, meat, or fat.

What does shrove mean?

When a person has been shriven, they have confessed their sins, been assured of God's forgiveness, and been given spiritual advice.

Why is it known as Mardi Gras?

Mardi is French for "Tuesday," and "Gras" is French for "fat." This expression refers to the fact that Christian households did not use fats during Lent, so they would use up all the fats they had left in the kitchen on this day.

Where did Pancake Tuesday come from?

Along the same lines, butter, eggs and fats are used in making pancakes, so the traditional way of using up the fats in the house is to make pancakes.



of 60 large round pancakes and measured an impressive 76cm tall. It broke the Guinness World Records in 2012.

2. It is widely believed that the tradition of pancake races began in 1445 in Olney in Buckinghamshire when a woman was making pancakes but lost track of time. Upon hearing the church bells to signal the beginning of the Shrove Tuesday service, she grabbed a headscarf and ran out of the door to church with both pan and pancake in hand, so not to spoil it

- 3. In Newfoundland, Canada, small household items are baked into the pancakes, such as rings, thimbles, coins and pencil stubs. The person who discovers a particular item interprets it as some form of meaning. For example a coin could mean future prosperity, a ring could signify marriage and a thimble, in the past, suggested that the owner might become a seamstress.
- **4.** The largest pancake was created in Rochdale, Manchester, UK in 1994, by the Co-Operative

Union, Ltd. The pancake measured a massive 15.01 metres in diameter and was 2.5 cm thick. It also weighed a heavy three tonnes!

5. The highest ever flip was performed by Dominic Cuzzacrea. The pancake reached a height of 9.47 metres at the Walden Galleria Mall in Cheektowaga, New York, USA, in November 2010.
